HVAF's Programs & Services

Supportive Housing

HVAF has 17 different properties in Central Indiana that provide housing for homeless veterans. These veterans also receive case management with the goal of obtaining permanent housing.

Supportive Services for Veterans & Their Families (SSVF)

For veterans and their families if they are at risk of becoming homeless and need assistance with rent, utilities, employment and other essential services.

Employment

Our 3 full-time employment specialists help our veterans find employment by attending job fairs, connecting them to employers, offering resume and interview help, and more.

Outreach

Outreach Coordinator Rodney Jackson's full-time job is to go to the homeless camps in Marion County and reach out to the veterans. He provides them with essential items and encourages them to seek HVAF's services.
