## Operation Alpha 2017: A night full of 'extraordinary generosity'

Predicted to be the "most ambitious fundraiser yet," Operation Alpha lived up to the hype and provided a night full of memorable cocktails, delicious food, live music, auction bidding and much more.

For the past three years, HVAF of Indiana and Hotel Tango Artisan Distillery have teamed up to host Operation Alpha. Travis Barnes, a service-disabled Marine Corps veteran and co-owner of Hotel Tango, started the event at the distillery to help veterans in need.

The evening kicked off with guests arriving at The Tinker House Events to a bar stocked with Sun King Brewery beer, Monarch Beverage wine and Hotel Tango spirits, and tables of food filled with City BBQ, Jacquie's Gourmet Catering and Black Plate Catering.

Senator Joe Donnelly was a special guest at this year's event. He spoke with attendees about the importance of taking care of our homeless and at-risk veterans and their families. When speaking in front of everyone, Sen. Donnelly referenced Matthew 7:12, "do to others what you would have them do to you."

"When you think about that, you're doing God's work," Sen. Donnelly said, adding how HVAF's mission follows this verse. "It's a ministry of its own."

The night continued with a silent and live auction, with guests walking away with Pacers tickets, a resort vacation, the opportunity to be a distiller and much, much more.

The highlight of the evening included HVAF CEO & President— and veteran— Brian Copes leading a one-of-a-kind Grog Bowl Ceremony. Brian honored our former and current service members by inviting veterans to participate in the making of the "grog," a very special cocktail,

while paying homage to our country's military history and the service and sacrifices of our veterans.

HVAF's cash goal for the night was \$11,011, in honor of Veterans Day, 11/11. By the end of the evening, guests donated a total of \$18,220, making the grand total for Operation Alpha \$32,000, doubling last year's total.

"I continue to be surprised and humbled by the extraordinary generosity of people who share our passion for helping veterans in need," Copes said. "A simple thank you falls short. We probably best express our appreciation by being good stewards of what we're given."

Hilary Barnes, co-owner of Hotel Tango, said the staff is "still beaming" from this year's event.

"From the Tinker House venue, a visit from Senator Donnelly, to the music and the Grog Bowl ceremony – it was such a moving and fun evening celebrating veterans," Barnes said. "And above all, HVAF surpassed its fundraising goal! This year was the biggest Operation Alpha event yet, and we're excited to start working on next year."

#### HVAF honors Don Moreau, Sr.

The life and legacy of one of the founders of HVAF and its first CEO, Col. (ret.) Donald W. Moreau, Sr., was honored Sept. 27 at a memorial service in the Pershing Auditorium of the Indiana War Memorial. Col. Moreau died Aug. 23 at age 89. His obituary can be accessed <u>here</u>.

The service was conducted with military honors, which included the Military Department of Indiana Ceremonial Unit Color Guard and the playing of "Taps." Speakers included Indiana National Guard Assistant Adjutant General Timothy Thombleson and Indianapolis Mayor Joe Hogsett

The Mayor declared September 27 "The Legacy of Col. Donald W. Moreau, Sr. Day" in Indianapolis through a proclamation that noted Col. Moreau's 28 years in the military, 18 years of service to the State of Indiana, and receiving a Sagamore of the Wabash from eight Indiana governors.

In that spirit, HVAF Board Chair Trent Sandifur and CEO Brian Copes announced the creation of The Colonel Donald W. Moreau, Sr. Legacy Fund to support the Moreau House, currently home to 30 formerly homeless veterans. The Fund is approaching \$50,000 in donations, which includes a \$10,000 gift from the Indianapolis Foundation.
